SPEED LIMIT CHANGES
Take Effect March 7th, 2016

The National Roads Authority (NRA) along with fellow members of the Traffic Management Panel (TMP) today announce that the proposed speed limit changes will take effect on 7th March 2016.

Members of the TMP include the Ministry of Planning, Agriculture, Housing and Infrastructure, National Roads Authority (NRA), Department of Vehicle and Drivers Licensing (DVL) and the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS). Public engagement for input to the proposed changes took place in 2015, and the TMP has strongly considered all comments and concerns.

The proposed changes are as follows, which are highlighted in the below maps, which also can be found on the NRA website. All other speed limits will remain as is. Please take note of the new speed limit of 20 MPH on North Sound/Roads in George Town, Alder County Drive in East End and a small section of the Espinoza Highway in West End.

Please take due care when traversing the roads and be mindful of these changes, which are:

1. Section in West Bay from 20MPH to 30MPH.
2. Section Tiberts Highway connection to Willie Foreington Drive from 20MPH to 30MPH.
3. West Bay Road from Central George Town to the Public Beach from 20MPH to 30MPH.
4. North Sound Road/Roads: Russell Way from Bikes Thompson to Butterfield from 20MPH to 30MPH.
5. Cross Road between the Shear Oaks and CAG: West from 20MPH to 30 MPH.
6. Steamship Road in Red Bay between Debra Drive and Dr. Tomlinson Roundabout from 20MPH to 30MPH.
7. Hill Road in Georgeown from Courtyards to the end from 20MPH to 30MPH.
8. Anton Rodden Road from 20MPH to 30MPH.
9. Aubin Conolly Drive from east of Jameson Drive to near Martin's Tortuga Club, Popehead Road from 20MPH to 30MPH.
